### I. 2006 OVERVIEW OF IAC FINANCE

The financial status of IAC was stable during 2006. During 2005-2006, the IAC obtained sufficient funding to complete its current set of studies without incurring any debt. To date, IAC has obtained project grants from foundations, governments, a corporation, and a private benefactor, totalling nearly \$3,000,000. The Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences (KNAW) provides an annual contribution to and in-kind support for the IAC Secretariat totalling Euro 270,000. IAC Board member academies also provide support for the IAC Secretariat and IAC studies. In 2006, voluntary financial commitments to IAC included \$50,000 from the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, Euro 20,000 from the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft, and \$5,000 from the Chinese Academy of Sciences. The Japan Ministry of Foreign Affairs provided Euro 10,000. Contributions to the IAC energy study include \$50,000 from the Brazilian Academy of Sciences, \$60,000 from the Chinese Academy of Sciences, and Euro 100,000 from the Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft, as well as local support for IAC regional energy workshops hosted by the Indian National Science Academy, the French Academy of Sciences, and the Science Council of Japan. The U.S. National Academy of Sciences provided \$25,000 for support of the Women for Science study report dissemination.

#### **FINANCIAL STATEMENT 2006**

**Secretariat**. In 2006, total IAC Secretariat expenditures were within the total budget target approved by the Board in February 2006. Within the overall Secretariat budget, reductions in expenditures for staff travel were offset by a special outlay for printing and mailing of a new IAC report *Women for Science*.

**Transitions to Sustainable Energy Systems.** Sufficient financial resources have been obtained to complete this study project through to the final report publication and distribution. The total costs of the study are projected at Euro 840,000. To date, funds received for this study total Euro 842,277. These funds have been received from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the Government of Brazil, the U.N. Foundation, the Deutche Forschungsgemeinshaft, and the Energy Foundation. As of 31 December 2006, there was an IAC account balance of Euro 219,824. Additional in-kind support of this project has been provided by the Hewlett Foundation, the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the Brazilian Academy of Sciences, and the Science Council of Japan, totalling more than Euro 340,000.

**Women for Science.** This project has been completed with sufficient financial resources. Funds committed for this project total Euro 178,130. Expenditures as of 31 December 2006 total Euro 172,339, with a remaining balance of Euro 5,791. Funds for this project were obtained from the Netherlands Ministry of Education and Research, the L'Oreal Corporation, the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, a private benefactor, the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, and in-kind support from funds available to the IAC Secretariat for printing and mailing of IAC publications.

**Science and Technology (S&T) Indicators.** An expert workshop was convened in 2006 for the purposes of developing a Terms of Reference for a project to improve worldwide indicators of S&T. Expenses for this workshop were met from an IAC account funded by a special Euro 10,000 payment to IAC from the Japan Ministry of Foreign Affairs in March 2006.

#### **FINANCIAL PROJECTION 2007**

**2007 Budget for IAC Secretariat.** The proposed Secretariat budget for 2007 is Euro 423,000. Increased expenditures will occur for activities in website/public information; funding development; travel and meetings for anticipated additional IAC staff in 2007; and reimbursements for project costs. Like the KNAW, the U.S. National Academy of Sciences will continue to absorb part of the costs of the IAC staff positions. Funds are anticipated for support of the Secretariat in 2007 at the projected budget target.

**Transitions to Sustainable Energy Systems.** Sufficient financial resources have been obtained to complete this study through to the final report publication and distribution. If the IAC Board decides to pursue further activities for project follow-up, additional resources will have to be found.

**Women for Science**. Sufficient financial resources were obtained to complete this study project through to the final report publication and distribution. If the IAC Board decides to pursue further activities for project follow-up, additional resources will have to be found.

#### FINANCING OF NEW IAC PROGRAMS

Funding is the limiting factor for launching new IAC studies and programs. Past experience indicates that a full eighteen-month IAC study with regional workshops (such as the studies on African agriculture and sustainable energy resources) requires funding of \$1,250,000. A professional effort for generating worldwide publicity for the study requires an additional \$250,000. Thus IAC should set a funding target of \$1,500,000 for each new large-scale study.

To expand the portfolio of IAC programs, three new funding initiatives are proposed: increased participation of IAC Board members; creation of an external advisory group; and new staffing contributions to the IAC.

IAC Board Members' Participation in Funding Development. Expanding the portfolio of IAC programs will require members of the IAC Board to become more actively engaged in efforts to identify sources and secure funds. This requires considerable time and effort to secure funding from donors, including government agencies, foundations, corporations, and private philanthropists. An IAC Board committee should be established to provide ideas and advice on potential new funding sources.

**Proposed IAC Development Advisory Group.** It is proposed to establish a new IAC Development Advisory Group, composed of experienced individuals from the S&T community, international organizations, foundations, corporations, and philanthropies. This Development Advisory Group would advise the IAC Board on funding prospects for specific projects and help with development of an endowment for providing ongoing financial support of IAC programs.

Proposed New Staffing Contribution from IAC Member Academies. The scope and range of new IAC studies and programs being planned for 2007 will require greater staff resources. It is proposed to expand the IAC Secretariat through a new global network of senior-level staff. To begin, three new staff positions – IAC Associate Directors – would be appointed to provide greater professional support and oversight for IAC studies and programs. These persons would be appointed from staff or associates of IAC member academies; they would serve in the IAC staff positions on either a full-time or part-time basis. Salaries for these new Associate Directors would be provided by their host academies. These IAC Associate Directors would work primarily at their employing academies, utilizing communications technologies to conduct assignments in coordination with Amsterdam-based staff. Staff meetings and assignments at the IAC Secretariat would be funded by the IAC to enhance teamwork.
